Connected Hubs is a network of Southern African innovation support organisations with linkages to international innovation ecosystems.

WHAT WE DO

With a shared goal to enable and facilitate the development of early stage entrepreneurs, we have embarked upon a journey to collaborate to share best practises.

WE ARE REGIONAL

The actors are from Botswana, Namibia, South Africa, Tanzania and Zambia, the broader SADC region and beyond. Many have

Derrick Kotze, mLabs Southern Africa Connected Hubs share best practices in innovation support through online and offline training sessions together with international experts. In 2018, they produced the Annual Southern Africa Innovation Forum (ASAIF) a regional platform which is a flagship of the Southern Africa Innovation Support Programme (SAIS 2). SAIS 2 facilitates improved networks through Connected Hubs by connecting actors for a joint cause, providing training skills for a lasting impact in their local innovation ecosystems as well as building trust between the actors across regions.

Connected Hubs activities are set to grow based on learnings from 2018 and scale to include more hubs from the SADC region and beyond. By the end of the year 2019, Connected Hubs will have built bridges between 20 business support organisations across seven countries, supported over 300 early-stage entrepreneurs and strengthened ten early-stage, impact-driven start-ups. Overall hubs have strengthened their skills in start-up coaching and regional collaboration.



ACTIONS & OUTCOMES



Building capacity in supporting innovation & entrepreneurship

10 organisations in five Southern African countries have improved event management skills. Training has enhanced the capacity of innovation support organisations to produce their events as well as facilitate dialogues around entrepreneurship and innovation ecosystems - a learning that sets precedence for the innovation community in the national systems.



Connectivity within Southern Africa and internationally

In a short span of intense activity (four months), 70 % of the members consider that being a part of Connected Hubs has improved their organisation's connectivity to other likeminded actors in Southern Africa. "Through the membership, we've been able to know the activities of other hubs in detail and the sessions have helped us spot opportunities for collaborations and helped us form and strengthen the bond with the member hubs."



Supporting early-stage entrepreneurs and startups

SAIS 2 enables entrepreneurs gain access to valuable networks comprising investors, potential partners and peers at an international event at Slush. SAIS 2 in partnership with Slush Global Impact Accelerator (Slush GIA) enabled the five most promising startups in Southern Africa an opportunity to develop their entrepreneurial skills, including service offering and business modeling, pitching and go to market -strategies. Connected Hubs coached 215 early-stage start-ups in three SAIS 2 countries and ran pitching competitions with Slush GIA to select the promising five start-ups representing SAIS 2 Partner countries.

STARTUPS 2017

In 2017, SAIS 2 piloted cross-border collaboration with Botswana Innovation Hub and Fablab Namibia. The three organisations supported two startups from Namibia and three from Botswana to attend Slush 2017 in Helsinki with hub managers. The five start-ups took part in a 2-month incubator programme with coaching sessions, on pitching, business mentoring and product development.


